⚙️ What Exactly Is an MVP (and Why Founders Keep Getting It Wrong)

An MVP isn't a "cheap version" of your dream app.

It's a **functional prototype that proves your idea deserves to exist.**

The 5 Stages of a 90-Day MVP Launch

Stage 1: Discovery & Validation (Days 1–15)

Before you write code, write your hypothesis.

Your mission:

- Identify your target audience.
- Validate the problem with real users.
- Define your **Core Value Proposition**.

Tools that help:

- Notion or Miro (for mapping ideas)
- Typeform (for validation surveys)
- Google Trends (to measure demand)

Stage 2: Scope Like a Pro (Days 16–25)

The secret to fast MVPs isn't working harder — it's choosing smarter.

Steps:

- List all possible features.
- Use the **MoSCoW method** (Must, Should, Could, Won't).
- Prioritize “must-haves” that directly support your hypothesis.

Example:

Feature	Priority	Reason
User Login	Must	Essential for data
Dark Mode	Won't	Cosmetic only
Payment Gateway	Could	For later stages

Stage 3: Design & Prototype (Days 26–45)
